## Peaceful Leanings

You may be aware that many congregations run on a calendar similar to a school year. The Fellowship's fiscal year runs from July through June, thus making this the typical time for yearend reports and annual meetings. As I plan to travel and not be present for the Fellowship meeting, June 15, I will highlight some of the programs from the past year.

**A Bit of History:** In March of 2024, I began a conversation with members of the

Steering Committee and Sunday Service Planning Team. We came to an agreement around several objectives that I, as Community Engagement Coordinator, would tend to, as follows:

- Increased participation in and attendance at services and other gatherings offered by PUUF
- Spiritual needs of the Fellowship through relevant services and small group activities will be better addressed
- Professional ministry to supplement lay-led services will be secured
- Theme-based ministry in planning the services and programming, such as small group ministry, small group spiritual direction sessions, affinity groups, etc., to provide continuity and consistency to UU services

The focus of my ministry to the Fellowship has been to *Make Friends, Grow Spirit, Do Good*, a motto we have embraced through the following:

- Hosted two professional ministers last summer
  - Began a collaboration with Foothills Unitarian (Fort Collins) with the series *What Our World Needs Now: Universalism in a Polarized Age*
  - Began a small-group ministry we call Going Deeper Sharing Circle
  - Held a Winter Solstice Ritual with 25 people in attendance
  - Went to four Sundays of programming each month, continuing the Going Deeper Circle and adding Action Sunday!
  - Hosted guest speakers from the community, while drawing from our members and friends to provide service content and music – both video and live – Thank You, Dave and Susan! (and guest musicians)
  - Continued having a Zoom presence – Thank You, Kay!
  - Started Share the Plate, giving to organizations in our community
  - Had weekly (almost) articles in the *Pagosa Sun* and the online *Pagosa Daily Post*
  - Strengthened our interfaith relationships within the community
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- Started the process to re-certify as a Welcoming Congregation
- Sponsoring, as part of an interfaith partnership, host of Pagosa Pride in June 2025
- Reviewed and updated the Pagosa UU Fellowship website – Thank you, Barbara!

As we lean into a new Fellowship year beginning in July, my heart is full knowing this small community of fellow seekers. I am inspired by those I am working closely with and blessed by the growing relationships with new friends.

Let us be a beacon of love and light in the world.

"I often wonder about the impossible being possible," Heidi says. "About loving all that differentiates person from person from person. And what becomes possible when difference is an asset rather than a problem to be solved or feared. We are a relational species. Heidi earned her Bachelor of Science in biology at Duke University. Her doctorate is in ecosystem ecology from the University of Colorado at Boulder. And soon she will complete her master's in theological studies at the Iliff School of Theology.

Our group leader is a certified meditation instructor, authorized Dharma teacher, and longtime student of Khenpo Migmar Tseten, Buddhist Chaplain at Harvard University.

Although we will be practicing traditional Buddhist meditations, one does not have to be Buddhist to benefit from these beautiful practices. Meditation instructions are reviewed every session, so newcomers can learn as those more experienced deepen their practice.

Please bring a blanket and water. Meditation cushions and chairs will be provided. Sessions will begin promptly, so please arrive a few minutes early to settle in. For the consideration of others, mask wearing is encouraged.
